

Remnants of Hurricane Ida: EM-3573
Incident Period: September 1, 2021 and Continuing

The President approved Emergency Declaration EM3573 for the State of New Jersey on September 2, 2021. The emergency declaration makes federal funding available to state and local governments and certain private nonprofit organizations on a cost-sharing basis for emergency protective measures. This emergency declaration covers all 21 New Jersey counties **for CAT B ONLY/EMERGENCY PROTECTIVE MEASURES**.

NJOEM is actively working with FEMA to conduct Preliminary Damage Assessments (PDAs) to support a major disaster declaration request, which may allow for additional categories of work to be awarded. As part of this process, we are asking applicants who were not part of the in-person Joint FEMA-State PDA on Saturday (9/4/21) to please complete the attached PDA sheet.
